1. Apologies for absence

4. Chair's Report

SC gave a summary of the year's activities, highlighting the relationship with the Haque, the website and the updated e-newsletter format.

Thanks were given to Phil and Pam for organising the trip Winchester in September. Thanks were given to Richard Morris for his role in assisting the organisation for the Yr Yswgrn awards ceremony in October.

Richard Morris gave a report about the Yr Yswgrn awards ceremony. Introduced the poet Hedd Wynn and the award-winning project led by the Snowdonia National Park Authority.

Richard Morris summarised the events of the European Cultural Heritage Summit held in Paris from 27-31st October.
